



Founded in 2012 in São Paulo, Veneta is the premiere comics publisher in the Brazilian market. It has launched authors who have won every major national award, including Jabuti and Grampo, while also receiving worldwide recognition, such as Eisner-winning Marcelo D'Salete and Marcello Quintanilha, who has been honored at Angoulême twice. Veneta is also the Brazilian home of many international legends, such as Robert Crumb, Osamu Tezuka, Alan Moore, Gipi, Gilbert and Jaime Hernandez, Ed Piskor, Yoshiharu Tsuge, Yoshihiro Tatsumi, Paolo Bacilieri, Miguel Vila, Andrea Pazienza and many others.

In 2022, Veneta launched OH!, an imprint dedicated to comics and picture books for kids, including widely renowned authors such as Jeremie Moreau and Gael Faye.

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Bertha Lutz and the UN Charter Amma and Angélica Kalil

A scientist, feminist, politician and suffragette activist, **Bertha Lutz** (1894-1976) was one of the few women to participate in the drafting of the UN Charter in 1945. In this graphic novel, Angélica Kalil and Mariamma Fonseca draw on the Brazilian activist's own memories to des-

cribe Bertha's role in the San Francisco Conference, where the letter was created. Between tea parties and tense meetings (and in spite of open resistance from both males and females), she was able to inject issues of gender equality into the debate, ensuring, for example, that the document explicitly mention "the equal rights of men and women".

Based on extensive historical research, the book recreates the behind-the-scenes of one of the most important global political events of the twentieth century, and a milestone in women's struggle for equal rights.

Girls Amma and Angélica Kalil

In this comic, Amma and Angélica Kalil bring together childhood stories of ten prominent Brazilian women, such as soccer player Marta, indigenous politician Sonia Guajajara and international icon Carmen Miranda. Featuring characters from different fields and regions of the country, **Meninas** builds a vivid and vibrant portrait of childhood in Brazil at different historical times.

Serena Finitude Anelis Assumpção and Aline Bispo

Serena Finitude is a lyrical and poetic narrative about love, life and death. It tells the story of two sisters, Serena, the one who came first, and Curiosa, the one who wants to know everything and understand the reason for things. They see the world through the window, observing the cycles of nature and reflecting on the phases and transformations of life.

This is the literary debut of singer and songwriter Anelis Assumpção, illustrated by visual artist Aline Bispo. Using painting and collage techniques, Bispo masterfully translates into images the caring, inquisitive and enchanting universe of the two sisters.

With references ranging from African and Afro-Brazilian mythology to the universe of superheroes, Os **Afrofuturistas: O Ataque dos Kips** is an action-packed comic book that introduces children to the aesthetics and concepts of afrofuturism.

Pecora Marcelo Bicalho



Trip Around a Pea Deborah Salles and Sofia Nestrovski

Trip around a pea, by Deborah Salles and Sofia Nestrovski, narrates the intimate reflections of a literature student living between books and conversations with her cat. As British writer Walter Scott once said: "Cats are a mysterious kind of folk".

And it is precisely around the mysteries of a cat's mind that Trip around a pea takes place. Princess Pea, or Pituca, is a two-year-old kitty that was found abandoned in a cardboard box. Sofia, her owner, is 25, working to finish her master's degree in literature and practicing kung fu. Together, the two share a small apartment where they spend their time rambling about poetry, Shakespeare and the mystery of words. They also have occasional adventures, when they are sucked into the universes of their books.

The Soul that Fell From the Body André Toral

André Toral's comics feature the almost always violent interactions between white Europeans and indigenous people throughout the history of Brazil, from the 17th century to the present day. The book focuses on the survival strategies of native peoples, portraying them not as victims or losers, but as subjects and protagonists of their own stories, sometimes told in the first person.

In addition to being a renowned cartoonist, André Toral is an anthropologist by training and has researched and worked with Brazilian indigenous groups for 30 years. This experience provides the conceptual foundation of his work.


Rosário Alley Ana Luiza Koehler


Cumbe Marcelo D'Salete


